1942

After a significant rent increase, the Club begins looking for a new site. Renovations begin at the Old San Pedro High School on 12th and Cabrillo where the San Pedro Club stands to this day. In 1965, the new San Pedro Boys Club is completed.

2000

The San Pedro Teen Center is created. This teen center was the only full-time and fully dedicated teen program and facility in San Pedro.



2004

The San Pedro and Wilmington Boys & Girls Clubs merge to create the Boys & Girls Clubs of the Los Angeles Harbor.

2020

The Club added our 20th site, at the Harbor Hills Public Housing Community.









1937

Local businessmen began looking for positive alternatives for boys who were hanging out on the streets and negatively impacting their businesses. The Civitan Club of San Pedro established the San Pedro Boys Club.

1994

The Club changes its name to the Boys & Girls Club of San Pedro, to reflect the participation of hundreds of girls who found their way into the Club.

2002

The Club opens our doors to the Port of Los Angeles Boys & Girls Club, which serves youth in 600 public housing units and low-income neighborhoods surrounding the Rancho San Pedro Public Housing community.

2019

The BGCLAH added an additional 6 sites with the merger of the South Bay Boys & Girls Club.

2020-2021

In response to the Covid-19 pandemic, the BGCLAH implemented virtual programming, increased safety measures, distance learning support, a Bookstore on Wheels, and full day programming. Additionally,

the Weekend Wellness Food Distribution was created, providing over 1,200 families every Friday with enough food support to last them from Friday to Sunday. In May of 2021, the Club served it's millionth meal!

LETTER FROM THE PRESIDENT & CEO

Dear Friends,

ords cannot adequately express the challenges we faced as well as the accomplishments of the Club during this past unprecedented year. Without a doubt, this has been one of the most challenging AND at the same time one of the most rewarding of our years here at the Boys & Girls Clubs of the Los Angeles Harbor. Challenging obviously due to the pandemic; most rewarding due to the expanded efforts our staff and board sponsored in response to the crisis and the great success we have had with those efforts.

As the world and community around us shut their doors, the Club's blue doors remained open to serve those who need us most when they needed us the most. From Grab & Go Food Distribution and Daily Virtual Programming, to Full Day In-Person Days and One Million Meals Served, the staff at the Club was able to quickly pivot from our normal operations to identify what our community needed to get through this pandemic together.

One recurring theme for the year is that we decided we had to make EVERY program and activity FREE for our members so that they would not be left out due to the terrible economic impact the pandemic had on our families. Over this year, we distributed over 16,000 books, 1,500 new pairs of shoes, over 9,000 sports balls, 1,000 art kits, 500 summer bags, and over 1 Million Meals- all free to our members and community!

Because of our expanded efforts in response to the pandemic, we received much recognition and support by our elected officials, the media, local corporations and our National Boys & Girls Clubs of America organization who steered their partners our way. Also, because of all of these efforts, the San Pedro Chamber of Commerce recently awarded us their "Non-Profit of the Year" designation at their virtual annual event!

Moving forward, the BGCLAH is focused on recovery. We are committed to continue to support our members with whatever they need to overcome this pandemic. Currently, we are engaging our members in our normal comprehensive programming: College Bound; Career Bound; Arts Academy, STEM; Sports; leadership development. All of our programs are offered daily and year-round at our 7 traditional sites which will soon become "8" when we reopen our Cheryl Green Clubhouse next

Spring. We have seen our 12 SCHOOL sites open once again for after-school programming starting on August 16th. We also plan to continue our WEEKEND WELLNESS program for the 2021-22 fiscal year given the continuing great need and the great impact we observed this past year-even though

it adds over \$700,000 to our operating budget annually. Lastly, we will continue to almost sponsor our "Bookstore on Wheels" throughout our 2021-22 fiscal year.

On behalf of our staff, members, Board of Directors and entire organization, we are happy to share our 2020-2021 Annual Report. We are so grateful for the support of our donors, grantor, volunteers, parents, staff, and the communities we serve for their 84 years of tremendous support and those who have stepped up and helped us do Whatever It Takes to Build Great Futures!





That is, until, he discovered the Boys & Girls Club of the Los Angeles Harbor.

Food Distribution Program

Without a doubt, the BGCLAH Weekend Wellness Food Distribution Program had a HUGE impact on families in the Harbor area this past year. This new program was created in response to the economic crisis so many families were facing due to the pandemic. Pre-pandemic, there was already a food insecurity problem in the three communities, which was greatly worsened during this pandemic-- a great need only became even greater due to COVID-19. The basic premise of Weekend Wellness is to provide a family with enough food for all meals from Friday evening through Sunday night. There are several food support programs during the week but during our current and continuing crisis, so many families were going hungry on the weekends due to being out of work and having a lack of resources for adequate sustenance at the end of each week.

The Club began our Weekend Wellness Food Distribution on Friday, July 10, 2020, serving 250 families with enough food for all meals for that weekend. As the weeks advanced, we were deluged with additional families needing food support. Quickly we increased to serving 350 every Friday,





then 450 and then 600 per week by January 2021. Shortly after that increase the Club realized that we had 1,800 families in the program -so at 600 served every week our families were only getting support once every 3 weeks. We then decided to make a HUGE jump and double the number of families served to 1,200 families (300% increase since July) starting in March 2021. That's over 40,000 meals distributed every Friday across our four distribution sites (Port Club in San Pedro, Wilmington Club, Cheryl Green Club in Harbor City and Harbor Hills in Lomita)!

On Friday, May 21, 2021, this program reached a huge milestone by serving its 1 Millionth Meal! And we aren't stopping anytime soon. The Club has made the decision continue Weekend Wellness for another fiscal year. And although this is a \$500,000 increase to our operating budget for the year and we realize this is a great challenge, we are committed to our community. Given the great impact and need throughout the LA Harbor Area, we feel we must continue Weekend Wellness for at least the 2021-22 fiscal year to continue doing Whatever IT Takes to serve those who need us most.

BOYS & GIRLS CLUBS

As schools closed in March 2020, the Boys & Girls Clubs of the LA Harbor knew that our youth needed to be directly engaged by our staff, program and facilities, instead of being stuck at home. We also knew that working parents needed a safe place for their kids and that SO many families did NOT have the connectivity needed at home for their children to actively participate in their virtual classrooms.

Therefore, on the first day of the new school year, the Club opened all 7 of our traditional Club sites for FULL DAY (8 AM - 6 PM) programming. Because of this 10-hour day instead of our normal afterschool program, we had to DOUBLE our staffing. We also had to upgrade our bandwidth and WiFi at all 7 of our traditional Club sites so that the large number of youth at each site could stream at the same time and participate in their virtual learning. Although the full day programming was a major increase to the expense side of the budget, the Club was committed to doing Whatever It Takes to serve our youth, especially those who need us most!


The Club served almost 600 K-8th graders in our Full Day programming during the 2020-2021 school year. Each member received three meals and a snack each day and had a pod leader to help them daily with their virtual classrooms and assignments. In the afternoon block our members were able to engage daily in our enrichment programs which included Fine Arts, music, dance, recording arts, computer graphics, STEM activities, leadership clubs, recreation activities and more.

Additionally, the Club had about 1,500 high school youth participating in our programming during the 2020-2021 school year! To reach our high school members, our staff developed a virtual program in addition to our in-person programming, which allowed us to serve even more youth! Our College Bound program was especially important this year as our members were able to come to the Club or get virtual help while schools were closed and students had NO OTHER daily and year-round college pathway assistance. Out of the 610 seniors in our College Bound Program 98.5% graduated on time, and 95% will be attending college this fall at schools like CSU Dominguez Hills, CSU Long Beach, USC, UCLA, Tuffs University, UC Berkeley, and Dartmouth!

All of these programs and services were provided FREE of charge for ALL members. By continuing to be engaged with Youth Development professionals and their peers, our members did not experience as much of the social and emotional loss that most homebound youth were subject to. This was another important reason why us being OPEN with all these activities and resources while schools remained closed until mid-April 2021 was SO very important for so many Harbors area youth!







One of the reasons why I enjoy working for the Boys & Girls Clubs of the LA Harbor is being able to work with our members

and being able to help them on their journey. Every day, our staff support them in succeeding in what they want to do. Knowing that you're a part of them being able to say 'I got accepted into this school' or 'I can't believe I was able to do this' makes all the hard work worth it. Building solid relationships with our members as we get to guide them in accomplishing their dreams is very rewarding and I wouldn't want to work anywhere else.

A YEAR IN REVIEW: COVID-19



GRAB & GO MEALS

Distributed 180,000 meals from March-July 2020 while our Clubs were closed for in-person programming. Also distributed 5,000 school & art kits, as well as 6,000 books, to our youth to keep them engaged while at home.

GROCERY GIFT CARDS

Partnered with community organizations to distribute over \$500,000 in grocery gift cards to families throughout the LA Harbor area.





VIRTUAL PROGRAM

While schools and Clubs remained closed for in-person programming, our sites became mini studios, and our staff became video producers to create daily virtual program videos in Arts, Academics and Athletics.

COLLEGE BOUND

With over 1,267 participants, our high school members are able to access virtual workshops, SAT/ACT prep, financial aid & college application assistance, individualized case management and so much more! 646 Seniors from the College Bound class of 2020 graduated on-time and 90% of started college this fall!



Doing Whatever It Takes to Serve the LA Harbor Community



SUMMER CAMP

In July, we reopened our blue doors for over 500 kids for summer camp. Each camper received an individual summer camp bag with all the supplies needed to participate in our Triple A programming. All of our summer camp sites increased our safety measures to ensure all our members and staff we able to return safely.

WEEKEND WELLNESS FOOD DISTRIBUTION

Beginning with only 300 families, the BGCLAH established a Weekend Wellness Food Distribution program. With the growing need, today over 1,200 families receive enough food to last them from Friday evening to Sunday- that's over 40,000 meals distributed EVERY FRIDAY.





BOOKSTORE ON WHEELS

By transforming a school bus into a Bookstore on Wheels, the BGCLAH has distributed over 35,000 book to youth in our communities free of charge! We have partnered with local schools and other non-profits to ensure that every youth has access to free books while libraries are closed.

DISTANCE LEARNING SUPPORT

While schools remain close to in-programming, seven of our Club sites are open to support our members and help them stay connected as they navigate through virtual distance learning. As schools begin to reopen, the BGCLAH.

With the pandemic limiting opportunities for youth throughout our Harbor area communities, the Club continued to search for ways to directly connect with MORE children as they were being relegated to their homes and virtual classrooms.

iven that we were unable to "bus" students from schools to our Clubhouses in our normal transportation during this time when libraries and schools remained closed, the Club has an idea! Our CEO, Mike Lansing, reached out to the Molina Family Foundation asking for a LARGE number of new books so that the Club could establish a "Bookstore on Wheels" that would travel throughout the Los Angeles Harbor area and distribute books to children who have been relegated to their computers. The Molina Foundation agreed with this outreach plan and provided us with 25,000 new books. A few other donors came on board and eventually we secured over 30,000 new books!

In the summer of 2020, we mainly drove the "Bookstore" to our 7 Club houses and then other Boys & Girls

way, we know there is a MUCH better chance the child will actually read the books provided. During the school year while schools remained closed, we partnered with other non-profits for book distributions including Rec & Parks Centers, YMCA's, churches and even set-up in shopping centers. Additionally, we hosted 3 large Holiday events at which we distribute thousands more!

Additionally, in December the Club was able to host three separate Holiday Give-Away events in our three regions of San Pedro, Wilmington and Harbor City using our Book Bus. Normally during the holiday season we have Club events solely for our members, but due to the pandemic canceling most events for the youth of our communities, we decided we needed to open it up to everyone. These were true "community" events and the number of families who participated by driving through was tremendous. We distributed over 16,000 books, 1,500 new pairs of shoes and over 9,000 sports balls during these 3 events. We also signed up over 200 additional families for our Weekend Wellness program. We were able spread a little cheer during a very subdued holiday season.



In the coming school year, we will need all 5 of our busses for our Transportation program. Therefore, we are converting one our large cargo vans into our new "Bookstore on Wheels" to distribute books weekly throughout 2021-22!


